

# TRANSIT, PARKING AND TRAFFIC COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

## JANUARY 22, 2015 1:00 PM

**Approval of Last Meeting's Minutes:** Matt Trantham made a motion to approve the minutes from November 20, 2014, after corrections. The motion was seconded by Jeremy McAtee. The motion passed unanimously.

Bob Beeler, Director, Design and Construction Services gave an update on the Razorback Road Widening Project.

There are three separate phases of this project: Phase I includes widening the road from MLK to north of Leroy Pond Road. All utility work has been completed for this project and the construction is about 70% complete. Phase I should be complete by June 2015.

Phase II includes Razorback Road/Maple Street intersection east to Garland Avenue. Utility work is going on now. When the utility work crosses the driveway going into lot 26 at the Administration Building, only one lane of the drive will be open so flaggers will be used. There will be a street closure for Stadium Drive. A temporary road will be built on the northwest corner of Lot 44 so the Razorback/Maple intersection can be raised. The intersection will be blocked. Phase II should be complete by summer 2016.

Phase III will be between Nettleship and Maple Street. This phase should begin in 2016 when funding has been secured.

### **Report on Current Status of Parking:**

- The number of scooter permits issued to date is down approximately 200 from last year's total of 1,493. We still have spring semester to go before a final count can be done.
- Transportation Study Update: A survey link has been publicized on Newswire and has been sent to all UA email addresses. The survey will be open through January 30. There will be transit ridership counts in late February and early March.
- Upgraded software was installed in the Harmon Avenue Garage over Christmas break.
- Work-it-off Program Update: 81 citations have been processed for the fall semester.
- Athletics plans to pave the Graham parking lot this summer. There should be approximately 800-900 student parking spaces when all lots are completed.

- Summer maintenance plans include the Harmon Avenue Garage, Stadium Drive Garage, Garland Avenue Garage, lot 36B, lot 75, Harmon Garage pedestrian bridges, and lot 40A low impact design (LID).
- The west stair towers of the Stadium Drive Garage will be enclosed with glass this summer.
- The rain blows water into the west elevators at HAPF. We will make appropriate elevator enclosures this summer.
- Lambda Chi will likely be renovated starting this summer.
- Phi Mu sorority construction will likely begin this summer on the northeast corner of Maple and Leverett Streets.
- Work in Pomfret, Yocum, and Gibson residence halls is scheduled for this summer.
- UAteach has moved to 946 Clinton Street. It has a small parking lot with an ADA and several F/S parking spaces.

### **Old Business:**

At the last meeting it was decided to require permits until 8:00 pm in the core of the campus. Lot 61 was inadvertently left off the list. Matt Trantham made the motion that Lot 61 require a permit until 8:00 pm. Lisa Frye seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

### **New Business:**

There are 54 spaces in Lot 39. Kappa Kappa Gamma has requested this lot be designated as a resident reserved lot for their sorority members. The lot could be redesignated as Resident Reserved, for the Greek house residents in the area, or as Faculty/Staff.

Consider clearing scholarship lots at 4:00 pm for 6:00 pm men's basketball games, specifically lots 56B, 56D, and 60 beginning next year.

Consider clearing scholarship lots 55, 56B, 56D, 60, and 62 for women's basketball games beginning next year.

Consider extending basketball scholarship parking lots for exhibition games beginning next year.

Consider increasing the parking violation administrative charges for unauthorized parking in or blocking of a disabled person parking space or access aisle from \$100 to \$150 and increasing the parking violation of athletics prohibited by sign from \$55 to \$100. The committee recommended using the increased revenue from the increased ADA charges for ADA awareness and education.

Consider allowing only one car permit per student just like it is for faculty and staff.

Consider making a parking violation for running the gate and the charge to be \$50.

Mikey King made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Tim Kring seconded the motion. Motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 2:35 pm.
