

Lot 44 FAQ for Students:

- When do I have to move my car from lot 44?
 - By 7 a.m. on Saturday, Nov. 19.
- Where do I park now and moving forward?
 - There are Student parking spaces available along the west side of Razorback Road in lots 74, 74A, 74B, 74C, 74D, 47N, and 46. All these lots, except 74C and 74D, must be vacated for home men's basketball games.
- What are the Razorback Transit options from the lots where I have to park now?
 - The Green, Purple, Green Reduced, and Purple Reduced Razorback Transit routes serve these lots along Razorback Road.
- Why didn't the university notify us sooner?
 - The starting date for construction on Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium was just set.
- Did the university consider making additional parking available if it knew student parking spaces would be eliminated from lot 44?
 - The Athletics Department and Transit and Parking Department have been working to construct additional parking along Razorback Road for more than two years. This past summer, lot 74 was expanded and 835 parking spaces are now available..
- Can I park in Lot 44 after hours?
 - Starting Monday, Nov. 21, students will be allowed to park in lot 44 on weekdays after 5 p.m. and anytime on Saturdays and Sundays.

Lot 44 FAQ for Faculty and Staff:

- When do I have to move my car from lot 44?

- When can I park again in lot 44?
 - Monday morning, Nov. 21.
- Are there going to be enough spaces reserved for faculty and staff to actually find a parking place?
 - There will be more Faculty/Staff parking spaces in lot 44 beginning Nov. 21 than before the construction began.
- How long will this section of lot 44 be available to faculty and staff?
 - The plan is for the lot to remain as Faculty/Staff parking throughout the project.
