

TRANSIT, PARKING AND TRAFFIC COMMITTEE MEETING

Approval of Last Meeting's Minutes: Chris Shields made a motion to approve the minutes from March 2, 2021 as written. The motion was seconded by Laura Shiver. Motion carried unanimously.

Report on Current Status of Transit and Parking:

1. The City of Fayetteville installed two sets of four-way stops on West Douglas Street. The signs were installed at the Storer Avenue and Oakland Avenue intersections.
2. A new electric vehicle charging station has been installed on level 4 of the Harmon Avenue Garage. It has two charging ports and is identical to the one in the Garland Avenue Garage.
3. The mask mandate for transit passengers and those in Union Station remains in effect per Federal Transit Administration and CDC regulations. This requirement is independent of the UA guidelines.
4. The Slow Streets program will take place through the month of May.
5. Parking is looking into paving lot 78A this summer. This lot is located on the southwest corner of Douglas and Gregg Streets.
6. Parking plans to pave lot 47N in conjunction with the Razorback Road phase III widening project - Nettleship to Hotz.
7. License Plate Recognition update - migrated to a cloud server. Almost completed defining every lot on campus with GPS coordinates and space designations. We hope to begin testing the LPR system by the end of the month.
8. We have ordered 500 front parking plates for people who want to pull through or back in, where permitted. The cost to the customer is \$10. These do not have to be purchased every year. We anticipate they will last seven to 10 years.
9. We have ordered scooter and motorcycle physical parking permits for this year. We want to evaluate scooter and motorcycle parking over the next year to determine where the scanning will and will not work.

Old Business:

1. Anthony Kammerer, ASG representative, presented a plan to change the campus road speed limit to 20MPH with exceptions. Karen Sebold made a motion to table this item for further research. Felisha Perrodin seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

New Business:

- a. Chris Shields made a motion for an additional option for accessible parking permit approval through OEOC. Ed Gbur seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.
- b. Jeremy McAtee made a motion to not redesignate lot 15 and lot 15A from faculty/staff parking to reserved parking. Felisha Perrodin seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.
